Project Managers for Urban Water Management Plan:

Per our discussion in the last coordination meeting at MWDOC, I am sending you a template letter for you to notify the cities or county you serve of the update of 2005 Urban Water Management Plan.

In compliance with California Water Code 10621 (b), we, the urban water purveyors, are now required to notify any city or county within which we provides water supplies that we will be reviewing the plan and considering amendments or changes to the plan. This is done so to encourage water suppliers to consult with and obtain comments from any city or county that receives notice pursuant to this subdivision.

At our last meeting, MWDOC has volunteered to draft a joint letter for notifying cities and county. This letter explains to the recivers that Metropolitan, MWDOC, and your agency are all in the process updating the 2005 Urban Water Management Plan, and that we appreciate inputs and comments on how land-use planning decision has made may impact water supply planning over the next 20 years. In your letter dated August 4, 2005 (copy enclosed) you requested input on how the County's land-use planning decisions may impact water consumption over the next twenty years in the unincorporated area for which the District provides water service. In response, the County land use decisions in this area conform to the County's General Plan. To assist the District in interpreting the land use effects of the General Plan, we have enclosed the County's forecast of dwelling units, population and employment growth for the unincorporated area served by your City for the next twenty years in five year increments (see enclosed table).

In summary, over the next 20 years the County forecasts 190% increase in total dwelling units, a 226 % increase in population due to new housing construction and a 285% increase in employees.




