Congratulations to CDD and IT! Golden Hub of Innovation Award Winners



On Friday, May 4, 2018, Community Development Department staff and Information Technology staff won two “Golden Hub of Innovation” awards from the Association of California Cities – Orange County (ACC-OC). Over 125 attendees assembled at the Fashion Island Hotel in Newport Beach to celebrate the award nominees’ inventive public policy programs that are designed to drive efficiencies and productivity in the application of city spending initiatives.

- **Technology e-Government: What's going on in my neighborhood?**

This program consists of an interactive online mapping application that enables residents to see all City-related activity going on around them. Whether it is a construction project, recent police/fire response calls, or short-term lodging rentals, residents can easily identify these features along with a brief description. The application is accessible 24 hours a day from the City's website or from a mobile device.

- **Community Investment: *Business Ambassador Program***

Rescue on the Santa Ana River

On May 7, at 3 p.m., Newport Beach Lifeguards and Fire personnel, as well as personnel from the cities of Costa Mesa and Huntington Beach, dispatched to the Santa Ana River for a person in the water. An adult male was located near the Hamilton Bridge on an island in the middle of the river. Lifeguard Captain Leeper used a paddleboard to swim to the victim. Captain Leeper was able to rescue the victim, and place him on the lifeguard truck where fire personnel provided medical attention. The victim was transported to a local hospital by a Huntington Beach paramedic unit.

Tips on Resume Writing

What is the single purpose of a resume? To get a job interview! A resume is a marketing tool to distinguish you from other equally qualified applicants. Think about these simple tips the next time you update your resume:



- Customize your resume using keywords from the job posting for which you are applying.
- Focus only on the most relevant experience to the job for which you are applying.
- The ideal candidate is someone whose career aspirations match the job posting.
- Stick to the truth. It's easier. If you lie, it will most likely show during an interview.
- Don't get too tricky with the layout. Most employers prefer a classic look. Format your resume so it is easy to read.
- Using lines to separate sections of the resume is optional; using headings for sections is not.
- Proofread! Proofread! Proofread! Proofread it more than once. If there is a spelling or grammatical error, it will be found!
- Hiring managers may reject resumes based on poor quality writing, not following directions, an unprofessional email address, and/or including a photo.

Health and Safety Tip - Safe Lifting Techniques

Lifting can put a great strain on your back if you are not using the correct techniques. The following tips may help you avoid back pain and injury when you lift:

- Stand as close to the load as possible, and have secure footing;
- Position your feet shoulder-width apart, with one foot slightly in front of the other;
- Squat down to the load. Bend your knees, not your waist;
- Before lifting, make sure you have a firm hold of the load;
- Breathe in and tighten your stomach muscles as you grasp the load securely;
- Keep your eyes forward, and your head and chin up as you lift;
- Lift with your legs, slowly straightening the knees and hips;
- Keep the load close to your body and do not jerk or twist.
- To avoid twisting, move your feet in the direction you want to travel.

Newport Beach Free Shred Event

On Saturday, May 12, the City coordinated with CR&R, the City's residential solid waste contractor, to hold a shred event open to all City residents. This event took place just outside of the Big Canyon Reservoir from 8 a.m. to noon. City staff provided traffic control, as well as assisted in removing bags and boxes of shred material from vehicles. Two shred trucks were on site to keep traffic moving. Almost 400 vehicles came to the event. Most of the participants became aware of the event from the NextDoor app. The next event will be held in November.



Rise in Graffiti Incidents

Graffiti incidents throughout the City have increased as the weather continues to warm up. Last year, staff and the City's graffiti abatement contractor, Urban Graffiti, responded to 2,304 incidents and we are expecting to exceed 2,500 incidents by the end of this year.

Staff inputs graffiti incident information, including location, photographs, and clean-up costs, into Tracking Automated and Graffiti Reporting System (TAGRS). Managed by the Orange County Sheriff's Department, TAGRS is a shared database used to store and track graffiti incidents. It is designed to help investigators identify and prosecute suspects. Since the database is shared with all Orange County cities and several law enforcement agencies, there is no cost to the City to access the information.



The Municipal Operations Department strives to remove graffiti from public property within 24-48 hours of being reported. Graffiti on private property may be removed by the City's contractor at the owner's expense. To report a graffiti incident on public or private property, please call the graffiti hotline at (949) 644-3333 or report graffiti online through the City's Quest system.

Summer Season Preparations


In preparation for the summer season, the Beach Maintenance Crew changes their work schedule to a 5 a.m. start in order to get the beaches cleaned up before the crowds arrive. Weekend staffing includes one supervisor, seven temporary laborers, and three crew members work four hours each day.



Activities include: daily litter picking from the River Jetty to the Wedge, CDM and Balboa Island; daily fire ring maintenance; the City's beach cleaner cleaning the beach six days a week in CDM and the Peninsula areas; beach trash cans emptied five days a week; and street ends, piers, and boardwalk trash cans emptied seven days a week by our contractor Robert's Waste & Recycling, Inc.

Sewer Lateral Repair

The Wastewater Crew made repairs to a 6-inch sewer lateral at 110 Via Ithaca on Lido Isle. The old sewer lateral had become a maintenance issue due to root intrusion from several joints. Staff utilized our digging Vector to excavate the area. Once the lateral was exposed, they were able to make the needed repairs and install a new clayline and cleanout. The Concrete and Asphalt Crews will repair the sidewalk and street next week.


Tuesday, May 15, was Peace Officers Memorial Day. We joined the rest of the country in remembering those men and women who have given their lives to protect others.

Public Works recently installed new solar-powered flashing stop signs. This will help capture drivers' attention, especially at night.




Fire Station No. 6 Renovation

Public Works recently standardized and condensed signage at all public piers. Signs are now more uniformly displayed.




Welcome Public Works Student Intern/Technical Aide Claudia Sifuentes

SPECIAL NEEDS PROGRAMMING

Over the course of the past year, the Department has made a conscious effort to improve and ensure that we are providing programs that serve our local population of youth and adults with special needs. There has been an influx of support from the community that has resulted in a full page of programming within the *Newport Navigator*. Programs such as art workshops with Lisa Albert, a lecture on legal guidance for parents of children with special needs, hosting a Special Olympics OC basketball tournament, The Unity Torch Walk, ballroom dance and classes for adults with intellectual disabilities through Coastline College. Mandy from Dare to Dance has seen a steady increase in the last three sessions of her ballroom dance classes, which began with 4 people and is now up to 18 enrollees.

This summer, through a partnership with the local chapter of the Friendship Circle, staff is excited to present "Summer Camp 2018." Held at Marina Park the week of June 25, this camp promises to be an action-packed day camp for children with special needs. This fun camp is filled with activities, field trips, a one-on-one teen counselor, and more.
