Recycling Collection Program!



CR&R Environmental Services, together with the City of Newport Beach are launching an expanded recycling collection program which will require all homes to have and use separate recycle containers.



Recycling program offerings include the choice of either a 32, 64, or 96-gallon blue lid recycling cart and up to one free additional recycling container. Additional recycling carts may be requested at a nominal charge. Carts will be delivered during the month of September and October 2021.

Changes in State Law

The State of California adopted Senate Bill 1383 (SB 1383) Short-lived Climate Pollutants in 2016. SB 1383 requires all cities in California to reduce organic waste sent to landfills by 75% by January 1, 2025. SB 1383 also sets a target of rescuing 20% of edible food currently disposed of in landfills.

Furthermore, SB 1383 sets and regulates maximum levels of contamination found in each waste and recycling stream, which ensures materials are disposed of in correct containers and properly processed. As such, the City of Newport Beach is requiring all residents to participate in the recycling program to minimize landfill disposal and to comply with state law.

Delivery of Carts and First Collection

CR&R will deliver recycling carts in the month of September and October 2021. Your recycling service day will be on the same day as your trash collection. Let's Work Together!

When placing discarded items in your collection containers, please be sure to properly separate materials in the appropriate bin. Included in this instructional packet is an easy-to-reference "How-To" flyer. Please note that Hazardous Waste should never be placed in any of your collection carts.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) are products that are flammable, corrosive, reactive or toxic. They are dangerous to the public and environment.



Examples of Household Hazardous Waste Include:

- Paint, paint thinner and turpentine
 Cleaners with acid or lye
 Pesticides and herbicides

- Glues and degreasers
- Gasoline and antifreeze
- Car and household batteries
- Needles, Sharps, Syringes, Lancets
 Pool chemicals
- Thermostats
- CF Lightbulbs

Household Hazardous Waste is not permitted in any of your residential carts. These items are accepted at one of the four (4) County of Orange HHW Collection Centers, with the nearest centers located in Irvine and Anaheim. Remember On Collection Day

- The carts should be placed at the curbside no later than 6:30 a.m. on collection day and removed from the curbside within twelve (12) hours after service.
- 2 The carts should be placed with the handles and wheels facing towards your home.
- 3 Place carts side-by-side approximately one (1) foot apart and at least three (3) feet from any obstruction (e.g., vehicles, fire hydrants, trees, or mailboxes).
- 4 All waste material needs to go in the cart.
- 5 If you have bulky items that need to be picked up or need additional carts on a regular basis, please call customer service at 949.625.6735.

Tips for using your Recycling Cart

- Only put loose recycling items in your recycling cart. Do not place items in plastic bags.
- Do not put Styrofoam, window glass, ceramics or Pyrex items in your recycling cart.
- Lids and labels do not need to be removed from your glass jars.
- Flatten cardboard boxes to create more room and prevent blockages in your recycling cart.

Preventing contamination in your Recycling Cart

- · Rinse jars to remove food waste
- Empty liquids from bottles before placing them in your recycling cart.
- Organic material and food waste should not be placed in your recycling cart.
- Plastic utensils, plastic bags and mixed products (containing paper/plastic or metal/plastic should be placed in your black lid landfill cart.

Frequently Asked Questions

How should I place items in my recycling cart?

Clean and dry recyclable items should be placed loose in your recycling cart. Items will be sorted at the Material Recovery Facility (MRF).

Can I put magazines, junk mail, paper bags and cereal boxes in my recycling cart?

Yes. These items are acceptable in your recycling cart.

Can I put pizza boxes in my recycling cart?

Yes, if not food-soiled. Or, you may also tear the top off and place in your recycling cart.
