4. OLD BUSINESS

A. Capital Projects

1. New signs have been placed along PCH and Bonita Canyon. The striping for right turns was to begin this night. Conversations with CalTrans about improving the transition from the toll road have stalled.

- A. Future of Committee the bike report was going to the City Council on 1/10/12. If the committee is approved for another period, there will be a new appointment process. Tony Petros asked for a clarification of the mission.
- B. Cycling outreach presentation Frank Peters presented a video on road diet removing lanes for cars which in the right circumstances improves safety as well as encourages cycling.
