Night Work

WHERE: West Coast Highway in Newport Beach. Two locations:

- West of Newport Blvd.
- Near 3400 W. Coast Hwy (A Market)

WHAT: Soil Boring

In preparation of a future construction project, soil boring will take place to perform a geotechnical investigation to assess the condition of the soil along the project route. This work only consists of 3 locations.

WHEN: Monday (10/15), Tuesday (10/16), and Wednesday (10/17) between 7:30 p.m. and 11:30 p.m.

This work is taking place at night in order to minimize traffic impacts and ensure motorist, construction crew and pedestrian safety.

*****Please be advised these dates and times are subject to change due to unforeseen operational factors or inclement weather. *****

WHAT TO EXPECT: Work will consist of drilling an 8-inch hole through the pavement and underlying ground to perform soil sampling. This work will cause dust and loud noise. Noise during drilling will consist of engine noise from the drill rig itself along with intermittent loud hammering noises. This will occur over a 2 to 3 hour period at each location. We will do everything we can to minimize the impacts to the surrounding area. Please be aware of posted detour signs.
