#### COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This ½ day (3 ½ hour) class will cover the following:

- An understanding of the changes in the 2016 edition of the California Building Code related to accessibility provisions. All permit applications submitted on or after January 1, 2017, will need to meet these new requirements. New or revised provisions exist for electrical vehicle charging stations, parking space requirements, adjusted cost of construction, turning spaces in toilet compartments, bathroom signage, and stair handrails. Some changes will correct drafting errors in the 2013 California Building Code.
- The 2016 California Building Code requirements explained for alterations to existing buildings. Topics include path of travel obligations, disproportionate cost limits, technical infeasibility, and unreasonable hardship. Examples and case studies will be used to demonstrate the requirements and proper decision-making process.
