

Kvasya



The oldest Russian drink is kvass, while the most famous is vodka. Mix them together, add cinnamon flavoring, and you get *kvasya*. Not for nothing does the Russian verb *kvassit* have the colloquial meaning “to booze.” To be fair, if done properly, a kvasya cocktail contains more kvass than vodka.

Ingredients per serving:

- 35 ml kvass
- 10 ml vodka
- 5 ml cinnamon syrup

Preparation:

Kvass can be bought in any Russian food store, and vodka and cinnamon syrup in almost any. To make the cocktail, pour all the ingredients into a glass in the proportions specified above. To the millimeter!
