INDUSTRIAL GENERAL PERMIT COVERAGE

The State of California requires industrial facilities that conduct certain activities to be covered by an Industrial General Permit from the State Water Resources Control Board. Industrial activities include manufacturing, hazardous waste and recycling storage and disposal facilities, and large-scale processing. Applicability is determined by the Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) Code, as identified by the business owner. Specific permit requirements are based on the runoff potential of the site, which varies based on where activities are conducted and if runoff can leave the site.

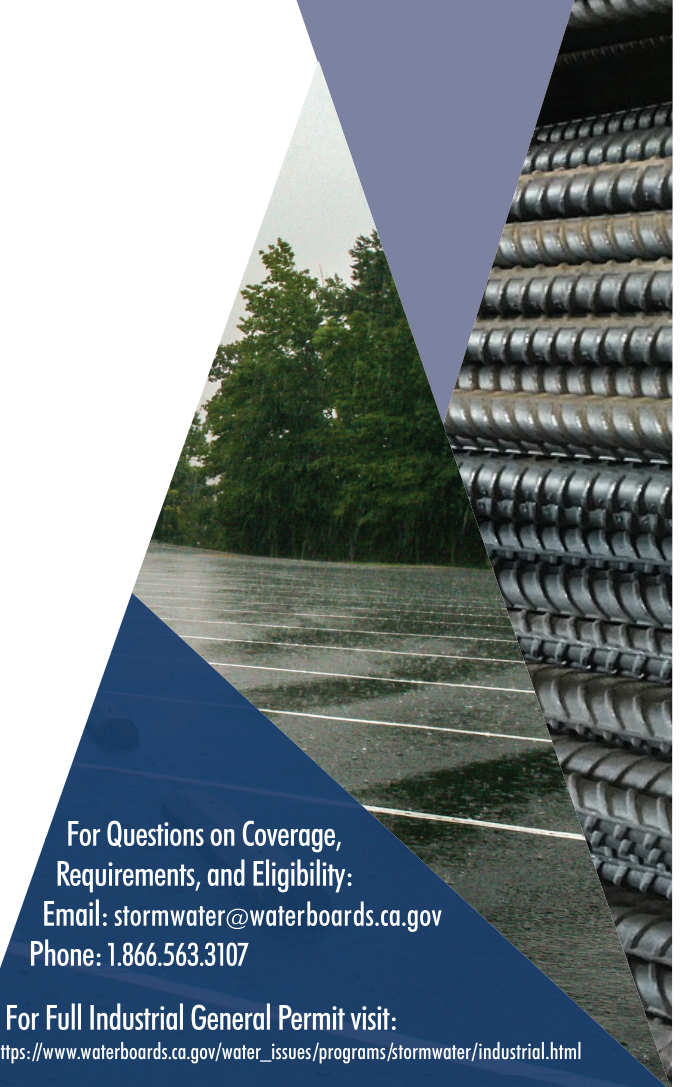
NEW REQUIREMENTS AFFECTING ALL BUSINESSES

Beginning January 1, 2020, the State requires that new business licenses and renewals with a regulated SIC code must provide a WDID, NEC, or NONA number showing coverage under the Industrial Permit Program. All business license applications and renewals require a self-identified SIC Code.

YOUR BUSINESS HAS RECEIVED THIS FLYER BECAUSE IT USES ONE OF THE FOLLOWING SIC CODES, AND IS THEREFORE REQUIRED TO OBTAIN COVERAGE UNDER THE INDUSTRIAL GENERAL PERMIT:

- ▶ 10xx-14xx (Oil and Gas Mining Facilities)
- ▶ 20xx-39xx (Manufacturing Facilities)
- ▶ 40xx-45xx, 5171 (Transportation Facilities)
- ▶ 4211-4225 (Storage Facilities)
- ▶ 5015/5093 (Recycling Facilities)
- ▶ 5171 (Petroleum Bulk Stations)

In order to process your business license in the city where you conduct business please verify that your SIC code is correct and matches the activity conducted at your facility. If it does, you must contact the State Water Board and obtain permit coverage or an exemption. A 90 day provisional business license may be issued by each city allowing you to operate until your WDID, NEC, or NONA number is received. If you do not obtain coverage, your provisional business license will be rescinded.
