VII. CURRENT BUSINESS

A. Special Trees Replacement/Removal Request - 1707, 1721 Candlestick Lane, and 1821, 1827 Sandalwood Lane, and 1317 Ashford Lane (Special City Trees)

Staff recommends the Parks, Beaches and Recreation (PB&R) Commission review the removal request of seven Special Neighborhood City Lemon-Scented Gum Eucalyptus (*Corymbia citriodora*) trees located at 1707, 1721 Candlestick Lane, and 1821, 1827 Sandalwood Lane, and 1317 Ashford Lane. Staff coordinated with a consulting arborist, Dudek, to review mitigation, perform testing, and provide tree assessments. Due to a combination of factors, the trees were placed at increased risk of whole tree failure. This request complies with the provisions set forth in Section I of Council Policy G-1 (Retention, Removal and Maintenance of City Trees).

Staff further recommends replacing any Special Tree(s) approved for removal on a one-for-one basis with only one of the following species: Australian Willow, Strawberry Tree, or Crape Myrtle, upon PB&R Commission direction.

B. Reforestation Request - Cliff Drive Park

Staff recommends the Parks, Beaches, and Recreation (PB&R) Commission consider the reforestation request of three City-owned New Zealand Christmas Trees (*Metrosideros excelsa*) located at Cliff Drive Park due to view issues. The applicant, Carolyn Slayback, residing at 426 Riverside Ave, has met the procedural requirements for reforestation established in City Council Policy G-1 (Retention, Removal, and Maintenance of City Trees). If approved by the PB&R Commission, there will be a one-for-one replacement tree installed at the applicant's cost of either Gold Medallion (*Cassia leptophylla*) or Purple Orchid (*Bauhinia variegata*) to be planted elsewhere in the park.
