AGENDA ITEMS:

- 1. **Welcome.** The meeting was called to order by Mr. Petros at 8:00 a.m.
- 2. **Self-Introductions** were made.
- 3. The **minutes** from the June 24th Aviation Committee meeting were approved without amendment.

4. Current Business – All Things Aviation:

O Update on CEQA process for Settlement Agreement Amendment/Extension. Mr. Murphy noted that the Board of Supervisors approved the consultant team for the EIR, and the City adopted the funding required for the City's half. November 2013 through February 2014 will be the technical analysis time, with a goal to issue the Draft EIR in late February. "the County is required to respond to every comment," Murphy said. He expects that June or July 2014 will see the final EIR considered by the Board of Supervisors and City. In an answer to a question, Murphy thought that the federal budget and sequestration issues would have no effect on the EIR process right away. Harp noted that Patrick Alford will be the City's representative to the EIR team. Mr. Mosher asked about ensuring that the Notice of Preparation (NOP) information and related scoping meetings associated with the EIR be highlighted on the City's website. He also was interested in seeing what the "no project" alternative will be.

Mr. Hawkins noted that the City will pay for half of the EIR costs. He also expressed concerns about the role of Gary Sherwin of Newport Beach and Company in working with the airport on new markets. Nancy Alston agreed with Mr. Hawkins' concerns, saying that more advocacy for markets could affect whether or not the "trigger" is affected in the proposed Settlement Agreement. At a Newport Beach City Council meeting on September 24th, Mr. Sherwin said that he was stepping away from the new markets task force as the settlement agreement is finalized – Mr. Hawkins and Ms. Alston's concerns surrounded any role for any person funded with Newport Beach dollars to advocate for airport growth that could trigger the trigger, even after the Settlement Agreement extension is finalized.

Mr. Pastore asked what issues will be studied in the EIR (answer: noise, circulation, air quality, more – all detailed in the NOP) as well as the impact areas to be studied (also in NOP). He asked if the noise thresholds were changed – Mr. Edwards said that the dB levels were not, and there is no potential to change the location of the Noise Monitoring Stations.

- JWA Operational Updates. Mr. Murphy spoke about trends at JWA, noting that, as of August 2013's numbers, the trend is an increase of about 5% in 2013 from 2012. August 2013 is only up about 1.7% from August 202, however.
- Clarifications on Tom Edwards' Monthly Report. Edwards asked if anyone had questions about his Monthly Report he pointed Mr. Pastore to the noise section and responded to a question about Ontario with a "stay tuned" as the battle between LAWA and the City of Ontario continues. He noted that international travel is what's keeping Ontario afloat, at least right now.
- Departure Procedures Update. Kiff said that he and Edwards had spoken to GE Aviation/Naverus and would continue to work with them as the FAA sorts through an initial departure plan for Atlanta's Hartsfield-Jackson airport. Hawkins asked if Naverus had been fully paid, at what amount (\$75K fully funded, Kiff reported). Pastore spoke about the FAA's work nationwide on RNP, and his hope that a departure pattern could be developed that minimized the impacts on "both sides of the bay." He asked the City to consider meeting with airlines' fleet managers to discuss more consistent departure procedures (such as power-back) versus departure paths.
- 5. **Public Comments on Non-Agenda items.** Mr. Hawkins asked about changing the room location if the early morning glare could not be addressed.
- 6. **Items for an Upcoming Agenda.** None were suggested.

- 7. **The Committee's next meeting** was set for 8:00 a.m. on Monday, October 28th, 2013 in the Civic Center Community Room.
